

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

Items accepted within Middlesex County's program, include (but are not limited to): adhesives, aerosol cans, antifreeze, car batteries, household batteries (rechargeable and button cell ONLY), brake fluid, drain cleaner, driveway sealer, fluorescent light bulbs (no broken bulbs, please), gas/oil mix, herbicides, kerosene, lighter fluid, mercury thermometers, motor oil, oil filters, oven cleaner, pesticides, petroleum lubricants, photographic chemicals, pool chemicals, propane tanks and transmission fluid.

Home Generation of Medical Waste

Although it is technically "legal" for a home self-care generator of syringes (sharps) to place them in the garbage if properly secured, there is a much safer way to dispose of these items. Many hospitals in and around the County, participate in the New Jersey Hospital Association's Safe Syringe Program. Hospitals provide "sharps" containers to the home generator. The generator subsequently returns containers to the hospital when the receptacle is full. Contact the hospitals listed below for further information on the program. Note: Needles should never be put in any type of container and placed out for recycling collection. This is <u>VERY HAZARDOUS</u> to all personnel handling recyclable materials.
