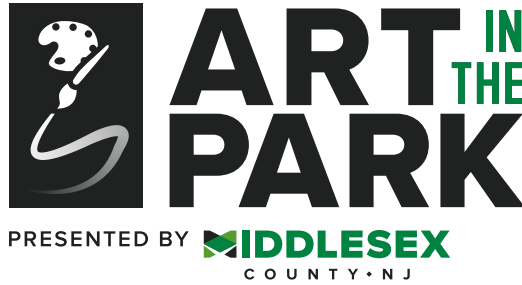


2022 SUMMER SCHEDULE
