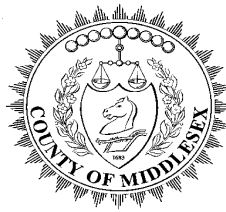

OLD BUSINESS

Early Voting Locations

Deputy Administrator Henry reviewed the early voting locations for the November General Election. There was one update to the location in Edison. The Edison Senior Center is under renovations. The Edison Municipal Clerk proposed using the Minnie Veal Recreation Center. A motion was made by Commissioner Katz to approve the 10 early voting locations as presented, only for this General Election. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Moskowitz. Voice vote 6-0.

Deputy Administrator Henry mentioned that Districts 7, 8, 9, and 13 in Highland Park would return to the Congregation Ohav Emeth for this General Election.

Charles Kratovil, New Brunswick Today Editor inquired if Providence Square in New Brunswick would be available as a polling location for the General Election. He also inquired if the Hub Teen Center would be the only early voting location in New Brunswick. Mr. Kratovil made comments related to errors in the voter rolls.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moskowitz to go into executive session at 5:25 p.m. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Frankel. Voice vote 6-0.
